

The National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (<https://www.niddk.nih.gov>) is hiring a Physician Scientist for research focusing on Disorders of Gut Brain Interaction and Gastrointestinal Motility Disorders.

Openings will be within the extramural Division of Digestive Diseases and Nutrition (DDDN) (<https://www.niddk.nih.gov/about-niddk/offices-divisions/division-digestive-diseases-nutrition>)

The mission of the division is to support research programs in the alimentary GI tract, hepatobiliary system, exocrine pancreas, obesity, and nutrition. In fiscal year 2022 the division made approximately 1,429 awards totaling approximately \$640 million.

Responsibilities of the position include leading and managing a program of grants and cooperative agreements for preclinical and clinical research and clinical trials in disorders of gut brain interaction and gastrointestinal motility. In addition, the position includes collaborative activities such as planning workshops and initiatives and providing scientific expertise to multiple other programs in NIDDK and NIH.

Specific research areas of interest include, but are not limited to:
Irritable bowel syndrome, functional dyspepsia, cyclic vomiting, gastroesophageal reflux, constipation, fecal incontinence, gastroparesis, nausea, vomiting, and visceral pain.

Applicants must have an M.D. or equivalent degree, subspecialty certification in gastroenterology, and relevant research experience. U.S. Citizenship is required.
