

Dr. Julia Scialla is an associate professor of medicine, nephrology, and public health sciences at the University of Virginia (UVA). She trained in internal medicine, nephrology, and clinical epidemiology at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. She serves as the director of outcomes research for a joint program in medicine and public health sciences and as director of the Nephrology Clinical Research Center within the Division of Nephrology at UVA. Her research focuses on chronic kidney disease epidemiology and prevention, with an emphasis on the role of metabolic complications and nutrition. She has worked closely with multiple chronic disease cohorts, including the Chronic Renal Insufficiency Cohort Study, the African American Study of Kidney Disease and Hypertension, and the Jackson Heart Study.
